Why State Legislatures?

- Policy pipeline
- Leadership pipeline
- Vital key to fair elections, voting rights, democracy
- High ROI for volunteer & donor time and resources
- Trajectory: narrowing federal protections + devolution to states
 - Challenges and opportunities

Win Elections:

- Data and analytics to identify the most strategic and competitive state legislative races
- Powerful grassroots, hardside field and fundraising programs
- Comprehensive candidate services program
- Candidate pipeline development: Future Winners
 - 2023: Sister District, EMILY's List, DLCC



Support Organizers:

- Organizer training, development, and community-building for 95+ Sister
 District Teams & Affiliates
- Annual Sister District Summit
- State Bridges
 - Fundraising event series for state-based organizations engaged in year-round power-building
 - Often led by people of color and centering experiences of those most affected by state policies



Develop Legislators:

- Purple District Network
 - National network of ~80 progressive frontliners
 - Best practices, governance and policy strategies
- State Power Table
 - Co-convenor with SiX and Pipeline Initiative



Educate & Empower:

- Award-winning political research program
- Civic engagement programming
 - Narrative Change Elevating the visibility and prominence of state legislative issues, policies and leaders
 - Partnerships with Crooked Media, Teen Vogue and more

SISTER DISTRICT: POLITICAL STRATEGY

<u>Blue Flips</u>: Chambers where maps provide Democrats with the opportunity to compete for a legislative majority

Blue Holds: Chambers where Democrats have a fragile majority that is in jeopardy of flipping red

<u>Blue Inroads</u>: Chambers where Democrats unlikely to flip in short-term, but where we must hold the line and position ourselves for future successes



SISTER DISTRICT: POLITICAL STRATEGY

Mix of Chambers + Seats Changes Each Year:

- Schedule of state legislative elections
- Shifting composition of chambers
- Broader electoral opportunities



SISTER DISTRICT: WHERE WE'VE BEEN

- 2017: Flipped WA Senate blue; held DE Senate; brought VA House within 1 seat of flipping blue
- **2018:** Flipped CO and ME Senates; held WA and DE Senates; broke GOP supermajorities in MI and PA Senates
- **2019:** Flipped both VA Senate and House
- **2020:** Only flips in NC House, WI Assembly, TX House, PA House, AZ House
- 2021: Lost VA House in tight red flip (633 votes in 3 districts)



SISTER DISTRICT: WHERE WE'VE BEEN - 2022

- New Democratic Trifectas:
 - o MA, MN, MD, MI
- New Chamber Majorities:
 - MI House, MI Senate, PA House, MN Senate
- New Governing Coalition:
 - AK Senate
- Held (Fragile) Majorities:
 - o NV, OR, CO, NM, ME
- New/Protected Supermajorities:
 - o VT, DE, NV
- Gov Veto Protected:
 - o WI; NC



SISTER DISTRICT: WHERE WE'VE BEEN - 2022

- Surge & Decline
 - Since 2004: Pres party lost at least 8% state leg seats in battleground chambers in midterms
 - Heading into 2022 with historical headwinds
 - 2022: First election since 1934 Pres party hasn't lost a state legislative chamber in a midterm.
- State Leg Shifts (net, not gross)
 - o In '10 GOP gained ~700 seats
 - o In '14 GOP gained ~250 seats
 - o In '18 Dems gained 300+ seats
 - **In '20 GOP gained ~150 seats**
 - In '22 GOP gained ~25 seats



SISTER DISTRICT: WHERE WE'VE BEEN - 2022

Small Margins for Success

- WI Assembly 2,993 votes in 4 seats kept GOP from supermajority (0.12% of total Assembly votes)
- MI Senate 404 votes in 1 seat won the chamber (0.009% of total Senate votes)
- MI House 765 votes in 1 seat won the chamber (0.02% of total House votes)
- PA House 63 votes in 1 seat won the chamber (0.001% of total House votes)
- NC House 629 votes in 1 seat kept GOP from supermajority (0.02% of total House votes)

2023: POLITICAL STRATEGY

Big Picture - Good Political Environment

- Historic midterm performance
- Down-ballot roll-off and enthusiasm gaps
- Virginia as GOP enthusiasm barometer
- Redistricting: heterogeneous landscape
- Better political environment than 2021, fair maps in VA
- Different states, different contexts



2023: POLITICAL STRATEGY

- Virginia: Flip the House and expand the Democratic Senate majority
- Mississippi: Create inroads in competitive districts
- Louisiana: Create inroads in competitive districts
- Special Elections: Endorse in special state legislative elections when strategically appropriate



2023: POLITICAL STRATEGY: VIRGINIA

- Senate blue hold (22D/18R = D can only lose 1)
- House blue flip (48D/52R = 3 seats to flip)
 - Dems lost House in 2021 by 633 votes in 3 districts
- No gubernatorial or statewide elections
- Imperfect but fair legislative maps
 - Retirements and open seats
- 2022: Democrats lost one Congressional seat
- 2023: Democrats won key special elections Jennifer McClellan (CD4), Aaron Rouse (SD7)



2023: POLITICAL STRATEGY: MISSISSIPPI

- Senate blue inroads (15D/36R/1I)
- House blue inroads (45D/72R/2I)
- Gubernatorial and statewide elections
- Legislative maps are further gerrymanders



2023: POLITICAL STRATEGY: LOUISIANA

- Senate blue inroads (12D/27R)
- House blue inroads (34D/69R/2I)
- Open Gubernatorial and other statewide elections
- Legislative maps are further gerrymanders



2024 PREVIEW

Blue Flips - Dems have opportunity to compete for a majority

AZ House & Senate; PA Senate

Blue Hold - Fragile Democratic majorities

PA House; MI Senate & House; NV Senate & House; MN House & Senate

Blue Inroads - Holding the line & preventing superminorities

Wisconsin; Georgia; North Carolina



2024 PREVIEW

- States:
 - Presidential battlegrounds
 - Competitive Senate races
 - Gubernatorial elections
- Districts:
 - Nested in Competitive Congressionals
 - Open seats
 - Fragile incumbents
- Candidates:
 - Inspiring and reflective
 - Ready to run hard and win
