## ABOUT

WISDOM is a state-wide grassroots interfaith organization that includes participation from 160 congregations of 19 different religious traditions. Since its founding in 1988, WISDOM has grown to include 13 affiliate organizations across the state of Wisconsin. They work on campaigns fighting for immigrant rights and to correct the narrative around formerly incarcerated individuals, and much more.

WISDOM leads the Transformational Justice Campaign, an effort to end mass incarceration in Wisconsin. Members and local affiliates have also been active in promoting immigrant rights, economic justice, public transit, and health care access.

## ISSUES OF IMPORTANCE

### Criminal Legal System Reform

WISDOM works to end mass incarceration and expand funding to community-based alternatives. They aim to close prisons and re-invest money in programs that rebuild the communities that have been devastated by mass incarceration. Ex-incarcerated People Organizing (EXPO) leads WISDOM's efforts to end mass incarceration in Wisconsin. EXPO also works to eliminate all forms of structural discrimination against formerly incarcerated people and restore formerly incarcerated people to full participation in our communities.

### Environmental Justice

WISDOM wants all Wisconsinites to live in a beautiful, safe and clean state. They know that climate change is real and the communities that are most impacted are communities of color. Over the past few years, members of WISDOM have joined together to fight for climate justice initiatives. WISDOM is fighting for the creation of green jobs and implementation of land and water resource conservation. Affiliates such as JOSHUA have rallied to stop unsafe pipelines carrying toxic tar sands oil under the Great Lakes. Led by the WISDOM member organization on the Menominee Reservation, WISDOM has made a commitment to taking a role in the "Rights of Nature" movement.

### Racial Equity

WISDOM works to eliminate racial disparities and improve outcomes for everyone, no matter the color of their skin. They advocate for changing policies, practices, systems, and structures to prioritize measurable change in the lives of people of color.

### David Liners

David Liners has led WISDOM Wisconsin for nearly two decades. Liners started his career as a Catholic priest working in Mexican churches on the southside of Chicago. He left the priesthood to become a bilingual community organizer for an organization in Milwaukee that started out fighting against hunger and evolved to address other social justice issues.

Today he leads WISDOM and its network of 13 local organizations that use civic engagement, education, advocacy and community mobilization to address inequities in jobs and economic development, transit, housing, immigration, criminal legal system reform, and prison reform.
