

Art is the founding Executive Director of We The People. He was born and raised in Flint, MI and hails from three generations of proud UAW members. Before WTP, Art was the national training director at the Center for Popular Democracy. He spent much of 2016 working in Flint responding the water crisis and helped launch Flint Rising. Understanding the Flint water crisis not as a policy mistake, but rather a crisis of power, he returned home to launch We The People, focused on building long-term multi-racial, working class power. He has a BA from Michigan and MPP from Harvard where he taught a community organizing class with Marshall Ganz. He's lives in Metro-Detroit with his wife Ashley, two little ones Emilio & Nico, and their giant dog named Kona the Coney Dog.

DANIELLE ATKINSON FOUNDING AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MOTHERING JUSTICE

Danielle Atkinson is the Founding Director of Mothering Justice and Mothering Justice Action Fund, two national organizations working to improve the lives of families by equipping the next generation of mother activists. Atkinson is a nationally recognized speaker with extensive experience as a church-based, electoral, and community organizer. Her early days working with organizations such as America Votes, State Voices, Population Connection, and The Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now prepared her to found Mothering Justice, a leadership development and advocacy organization in 2012. To date, Mothering Justice has trained more than 1000 women, reached more than 500,000 mothers in voter engagement efforts, led Mama Conversations around the country, and drafted the Mamas' Agenda, a policy priority plan addressing financial stability issues of mothers in Michigan. Mothering Justice has been a part of winning campaigns to strengthen breastfeeding rights, licensure for Michigan Midwives, protecting federal safety net programs, and earned sick time in Michigan. Atkinson also helped lead a successful ballot initiative to raise the minimum wage in both Florida and Michigan and establish a paid leave law in Michigan.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, CITIZEN ACTION OF WISCONSIN, HE/HIM

Dr. Robert Kraig serves as the Executive Director of Citizen Action. Robert took the helm in September 2009 at the height of the Great Recession, when Citizen Action was in virtual bankruptcy, and has led a dynamic team of organizers in rebuilding it into one of the leading progressive forces in Wisconsin. Robert is a leading strategist in the Wisconsin progressive movement, and is especially known for developing innovative approaches to strategic communication and issue campaign design and implementation. He has also appeared on major national and international media outlets such as MSNBC, Fox News and Al Jazeera, and has been quoted in national newspapers and magazines such as the New York Times, Washington Post and The Atlantic. Robert is the author of several major academic articles on American political rhetoric in Rhetoric & Public Affairs and other academic journals and collections. His book, Woodrow Wilson and the Lost World of the Oratorical Statesman (Texas A&M Press), topped a Wall Street Journal list of the five best books on presidential rhetoric.

ABOUT CITIZEN ACTION OF WISCONSIN


Citizen Action is one of the oldest and most respected organizing groups in our state. We are committed to achieving social, racial, economic, health, and environmental justice, operating all across the state.

- DEEP CANVASS! Our deep canvass model moves voters using listening skills, shared stories, and Race Class Narrative messaging. We continue to deep canvass on doors and phones to talk to voters and bring them into the movement and the organizing revival.


